

WHAT IS A POWER OF ATTORNEY AND WHAT DO I NEED IT FOR?

If your immigration status is risky, we suggest you file a power of attorney, a document that allows a third party to act on your behalf.

With a power of attorney, this third party can have some paperwork done for you, such as:



Transactions in bank accounts



Signing deeds



Buying or selling properties



Perform procedures related to your children

A power of attorney can be general (for lawsuits and cashing money, to manage assets or property, for commercial transactions regarding property) or specific (limited to the acts they establish).

This document can be processed at the Mexican consulates through your local office, for which you should follow these steps:



1. Visit your consulate
2. Fill out the corresponding form (at the consulate)
3. Present an original identification and a copy
4. Provide information about you (the grantor)
5. Provide information about the person to whom the power is granted (the representative)
6. Establish what type of power you are filing (general or specific)
7. Make a payment

In case of having a power of attorney granted by foreign authorities, it must be authenticated with seal and signature or authenticated.
