The **DGPME** has protection programs in place that can **help you cover your expenses** for a limited period of time. Some of the benefits these programs offer are:

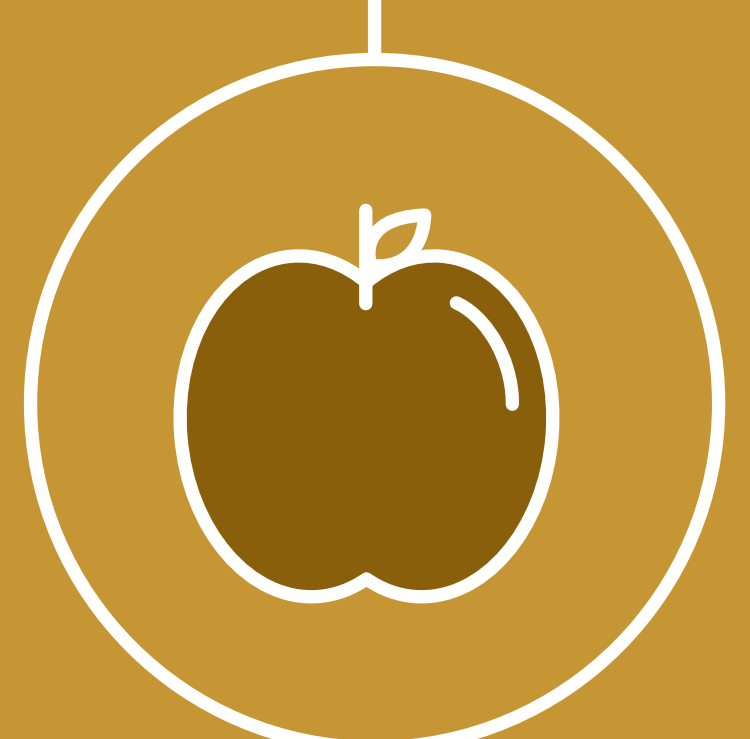
#### · During repatriation of **persons in vulnerable situations**:
