What are human rights?

Human rights are inherent to every person from the moment he/she is born. They do not distinguish nationality, gender, ethnicity, or social or financial status. They are universal and inalienable, which means all human beings are entitled to them and no person or institution can deny them.

How do I know if my human rights have been violated?

You know someone has violated your human rights if:



You have been forced to work under slavery conditions



You have been treated cruelly or inhumanely





Your freedom of thought, consciousness or religion has not been respected



Your private property has not been respected

The consulate protects you

If a person or institution has violated your human rights, go to the nearest consulate and file your claim. You only need to present proof of identity and proof of nationality.
