
## MY SON/DAUGHTER COMPLETED PART OF HIS/HER BASIC EDUCATION IN THE U.S.

CAN HE/SHE FINISH HIS/HER STUDIES IN MEXICO?

If your daughter or son completed part of her/his education in the U.S. (between 1st and 9th grade), he/she can enroll at a Mexican school to finish studying. To do this, you need to request a transfer document.

## How do I request a transfer document?

You can make an appointment at the Mexican Consulate. In order to request the transfer document you must submit the following (original and copy):



## Is it possible to validate high school studies?

To validate high school studies (between 10th and 12th grade) you do not need to request a transfer document. You just need to have the student's transcripts apostilled (for each grade completed). In case of having finished school, you must also have the diploma or certificate of completion apostilled.

Having a transfer document is very useful, as it guarantees that all elementary school studies will be officially recognized and the student will immediately be accepted in Mexican schools, regardless of the date of their return to Mexico or their migratory status.
